

Olvis Lee Edwards

April 16, 1927 - January 7, 2015



Olvis Edwards, age 87, of Lexington, passed away Wednesday, January 7, 2015, at the Westbrook Gardens Senior Living Community in Purcell, Oklahoma.

Olvis Lee Edwards was born April 16, 1927, in Elida, New Mexico, the first of seven children born to Johnie Dewitt Edwards and Verdie Ocean (Colter) Edwards. He grew up in Mena, Arizona and attended Acorn Schools.

Olvis served his country proudly as a tank crewman in the United States Marine Corp during World War II.

In the spring of 1951, Olvis escorted a young music teacher and her students from Lexington Schools to a field trip in Oklahoma City. This was the beginning of a lifetime relationship, and on December 20, 1952, at the First Baptist Church in Lexington, Olvis married the love of his life, Miss Donelda Butler. They made their home in Lexington, Oklahoma for the remainder of that school year before settling in Norman, Oklahoma where Olvis was attending the University of Oklahoma.

In the summer of 1954, Olvis graduated from the University of Oklahoma with a Bachelor's Degree in Electrical Engineering. He immediately took a job with Westinghouse, and he and his young family moved to Buffalo, New York in August of that same year. They returned back to Norman in January of 1956, and Olvis began a career in Plant Engineering at the Tinker Air Force Base.

They made their home in Norman for a few years, and in 1962, Olvis convinced Donelda it was time to purchase some farm land northeast of Lexington. They later purchased another farm from his sister, two miles east of Lexington.

Together they raised 7 children; sons, Darrell, Kenneth and Michael and daughters, Janet, Patricia, Luetta and Marlena.

Olvis retired from communications at Tinker AFB in 1993, but remained very active in his community. He became involved with Toastmasters International and won many speech contests. He served as Governor and helped coach and was instrumental in starting several new clubs. He was the Editor of the Lexington Observer Newspaper and spent a great deal of

time covering all things Lexington, from the local school to hometown news. Olvis was a longtime and faithful member of the First Baptist Church in Lexington. He was a wonderful father and grandfather, brother, uncle and a good friend. He will be dearly missed!

He was preceded in death by his wife, Donelda Edwards and his parents, Johnie and Verdie Edwards, and his sister, Winona Edwards and three brothers, Bill, Edwin and Leon Edwards.

He leaves behind three sons, Darrell Edwards and wife Lauren of Jonestown, Pennsylvania, Ken Edwards and wife JoRetta of Lamont, Oklahoma and Michael Edwards of Searcy, Arkansas; four daughters, Janet Bolin of Tyler, Texas, Patricia Frazier of Lexington, Luetta Edwards of Casa Blanca, Morocco and Marlena Boles and husband Teddy of Rosedale; his brother, Troyce Edwards of Purcell, Oklahoma; his sister, Arveda Rollins of Lexington; 13 grandchildren; 15 great grandchildren; several nieces and nephews, and a host of other family and friends.

Funeral services were Monday, January 12, 2015, at the First Baptist Church in Lexington, Oklahoma, and burial was in the Lexington Cemetery.
